We discussed the terms of who gets quilts and he assured me that the majority of quilts presented were to those suffering badly from PTSD and most had served in Afghanistan, Bosnia, Yugoslavia and saw a lot of terrible action there.

So, my new friend and presenter, AJ Letellier has covered 20 veterans at this time with the intention of covering more when he finishes his next PTSD program and hunting season is finished. He is a wonderful young man and is very enthusiastic. He loves his quilt so much that he was given that he made sure he took it with him for his latest surgery and sent me a picture from the hospital, smiling with his treasure.

So, I will no longer have quilts to send off across the country to transition centers in need because I am going to be busy motivating my local quilters to continue to make quilts for our cause and hope I have enough for all the veterans that have served in or retired to the Fraser Valley.
